# Artistic research roles, academic and pedagogic work

Until February 2026 she is Key Researcher (40%) of the artistic core team of Shaken Grounds. Seismography of Precarious Presences (FWF-AR 780, DOI: 10.55776) and works on completing her habilitation project as Principal Investigator (10%) Choreo-ethical Assemblages - Narrations of Bare Bodies (FWF Elise-Richter-PEEK/ V733-G26 DOI: 10.55776/V733). She was a Key Researcher at the University of Applied Arts in Vienna for the FWF/PEEK-Project Choreo-graphic Figures: Deviations from the Line (2014–2017), all three projects supported by the Austrian Science Fund. Furthermore, she completed her Practice-as-Research PhD with the title Being in Contact: Encountering a Bare Body (supported by one of the competitive PhD-Studentships) in 2018 at University of Roehampton London. Between 2014 and 2016 Mariella developed the artistic conception of the Biennial Dance Education 2016 with the topic Feedback and Reflection together with Prof. Vera Sander at the Hochschule für Musik und Tanz in Cologne. In this frame, she was responsible for the facilitation of the Think Tanks I & II and the Dance Education Conference (Ausbildungskonferenz Tanz -AKT) workshops in Germany. She professionally accompanied the international group of MA and PhD students taking part in the Biennale Dance Education as a mentor and facilitated the roundtable Forms of Research. From 2009 to 2013 she was Associate Researcher in the Performance Matters creative AHRC research project (supported by the Arts and Humanities Research Council) in London (UK). 2020-2022 she was leading the INTRA project Passenger Diaries with KT Zakravsky and Lucie Strecker and acted as dialogue partner for the INTRA-project Withdrawing the performer led by Charlotta Ruth and Jasmin Schaitl. As Senior Artist (50 %) at the Applied Performance Lab (APL) – a transversal platform, she has led the Antenna Research and Education since 2022. She co-founded APL, worked as a coach for performance and led feedback sessions. Furthermore, she contributed to the conception of the performance cluster in the MA program Applied Human Rights and Arts at the University of Applied Arts in Vienna. Since 2018 she is artistic director of PReS (Postgraduate Residence Studios and Performance Research Studies) in Kassel. She began her academicpedagogical work in Higher Education when she was a full-time lecturer (100%) in Dance (2006 to 2009) at the Department of Performing Arts, Faculty of Arts and Media at the University of Chester/ UK. Research Interests: I am intrigued by embodied research and feel drawn to explore how to communicate through the eloquence of the body itself, in my case contemporary performance and expanded choreography, particularly the practice of intra-action with bodies, materials, landscapes. My work often undertakes close-ups on slow processes and microphenomena. Over the last two decades, the outline of my research interests stretched from *Performance Matters* to *Choreo-graphic Figures*, staging beyond-disciplinary, inter-subjective encounters between the lines of choreography, drawing and writing. Through the development of a permutational score that can have different vitality contours (to draw on Daniel Stern's term) and *Being in Contact with Bare Bodies*, I explored the existential dimension and narrations through *Choreo-ethical Assemblages*. My current research focus extends towards geological bodies and explores the artist's role as a seismograph in the intricate relationship between humanity and an evolving, technologically influenced geological environment. The proposed research on *Intimate aesthetics* is the consequent next stage of my research and unfolds on the basis of my research so far. (Previous research results are documented on the project websites and book/article publications.)
